

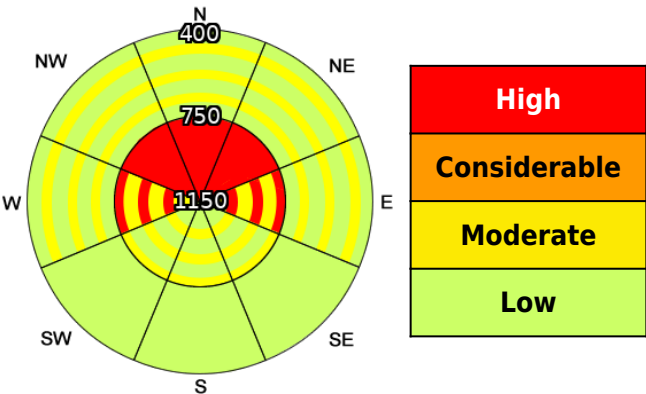

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 28/03/2011

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will generally remain stable with the possibility of a firm surface developing overnight on the higher slopes. Isolated accumulations of weakly bonded wind slab will develop in sheltered summit gully exits and around the tops of steep North-East to South-East aspects. These areas are not expected to be significant in size or depth and should mainly be avoidable. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be occasional light snow showers overnight and the odd flurry on Monday. Winds will be fresh initially from the North-West overnight backing West on Monday.

Comments

New snow amounts not expected to be significant. Cornices collapse will remain a hazard.
