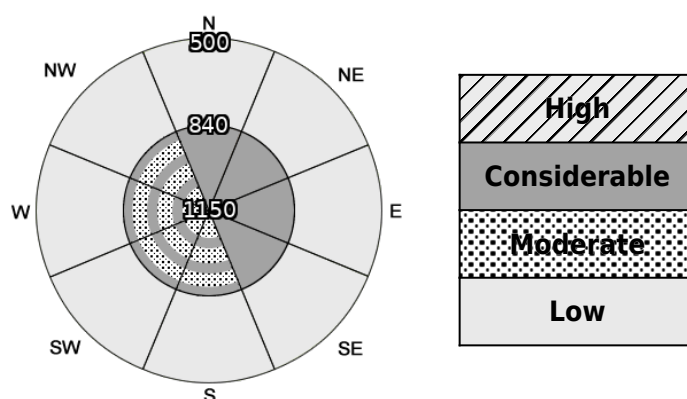


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 20/12/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Areas of poorly bonded snow will still exist mainly on North through East to South-East aspects where avalanches are likely. As the wind veers to the North-West, steep slopes, sheltered gullies and scarp slopes will be most affected with localised accumulations due to cross loading. New cornices will be unstable. Below 830 metres the colder conditions will consolidate the moist snowpack. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Dry conditions with the freezing level lowering to 500 metres, the winds will be strong from the NorthWest.

Comments

Today the snowpack became quite moist up to 900 metres. Tomorrow the strong winds will continue to transport snow forming areas of deep unstable windslab in sheltered locations mainly above 830 metres .
