



Avalanche Hazard Forecast

THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 28/12/2011****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The surface of the snowpack will refreeze as the freezing level falls. Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in sheltered areas, particularly on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects will be affected by cross-loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight the freezing level is expected to drop from above the summits to 1000 metres with heavy rain turning progressively to snow showers above 800 metres. Strong winds will be from the South-West. During the day heavy snowfall is expected above 500 metres, with South-Westerly winds increasing considerably in strength and veering to the West.
