

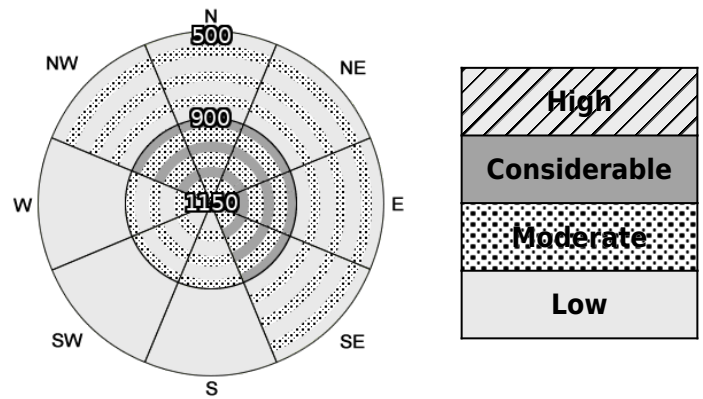

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 01/01/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At first the snowpack will remain partially moist at all altitudes, as the freezing level lowers during the day, the moist snowpack will consolidate further. New snow amounts are not expected to be significant and should generally bond well to the existing moist snowpack, however some instabilities will be present as windslab starts to reform. The greatest accumulations will be localised and mainly on North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The mild weather is expected to continue this evening, rain at first turning to sleet as the freezing levels lowers to 1000 metres. During the day snow showers above 700 metres with strong South-Westerly winds. Freezing level at 1000 metres lowering to 750 metres.
