

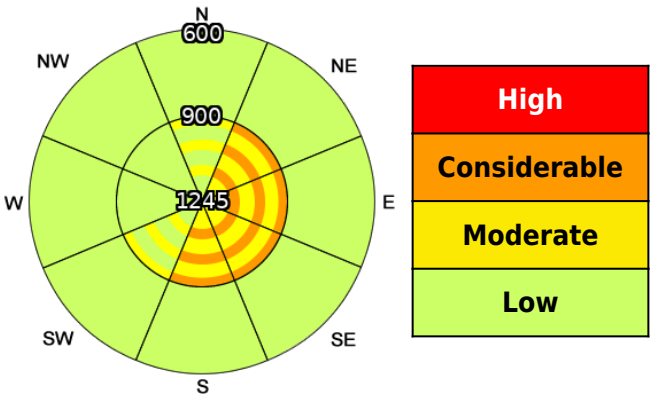

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 05/01/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will refreeze and will generally become well bonded and stable on all aspects. Some localised accumulations of drifted unstable windslab will form during the day on mainly Easterly to Southerly aspects above 900 metres. Localised deposits will form on other aspects due to cross loading, gully exits and corrie rims being especially affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level at summit levels will lower to 800 metres then to 600 metres in the day. Winds will be moderate West -North-Westerly becoming strong North-Westerly in the day. Snow showers throughout the forecast period are expected.

Comments

Getting colder once more which should help improve the snowpack and mountain conditions.
