

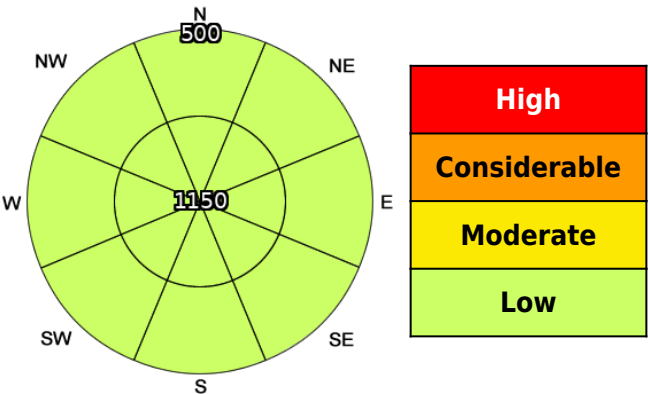

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 15/01/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm and icy in most locations, isolated pockets of shallow windslab will exist in sheltered areas such as summit gully exits and North-West to North-East corrie headwalls above 900 metres. These accumulations should be mainly avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will dominate giving mainly cold and dry conditions. Winds will be from the South fresh to strong on the summits Freezing at all levels on Northerly aspects and in sheltered glens elsewhere freezing level will be complicated due to several inversion layers.

Comments

Snow cover mainly limited to high corries. What exists is generally refrozen old wet snow giving a very icy and slick surface in many locations.
