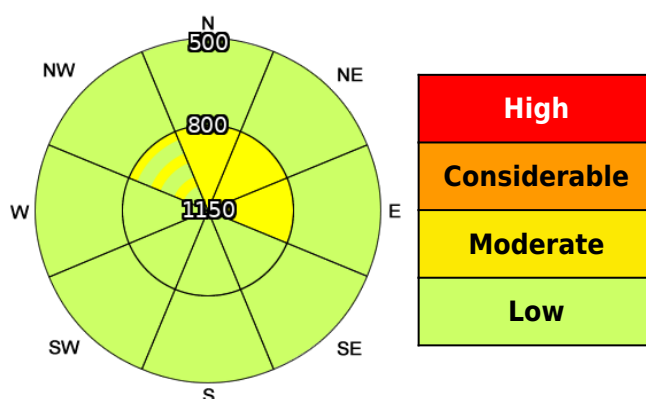


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 26/01/2012****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack on all aspects and levels will consolidate in the colder conditions and refreeze. Fresh moderately bonded windslab will be deposited in sheltered gullies and slopes, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, moderate rainfall at all levels is expected to turn to snow showers and then become dry as the freezing level falls to 600 metres. Winds strong South-Westerly soon decreasing, then moderate Southerly later with snow showers above 400 metres in the afternoon.
