

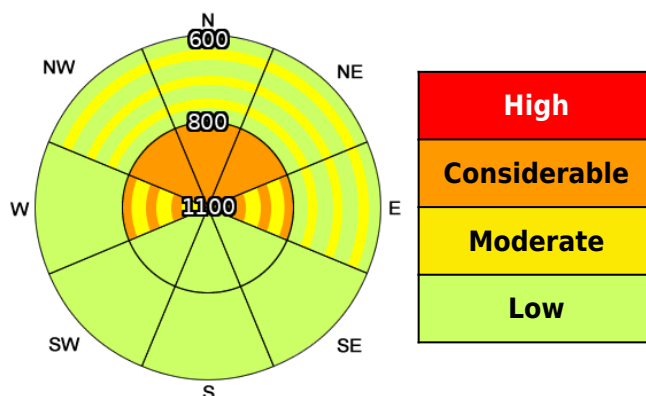
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 29/01/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snow will be re-distributed as weakly-stabilised windslab mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Build up will be rapid and stability will decline as winds strengthen through the day. Stability will remain good on all wind-scoured slopes and gullies. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold with a few light snow showers overnight and during the day. Winds will become much stronger South-Westerly then Southerly later South-Easterly.

Comments

Significant amount of soft snow at plateau level available for transport by wind. Stability will decline quickly as winds pick up.
