

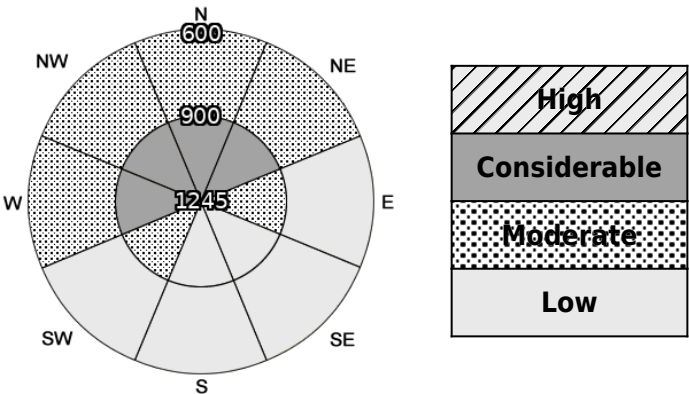

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 31/01/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build onto mainly West through North To North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully exits, and corrie rims being especially affected. Localised accumulations will form on other aspects due to cross loading. Cornices will continue to form and will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere below 900 metres and on wind scoured slopes the snowpack will be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snow showers are expected, winds will continue strong South-Easterly and the freezing level will be at 300 metres. No precipitation is expected in the day but the drifting of snow will continue.

Comments

Very cold conditions with windslab overlying some sugar like facettted grains layers at ground level, producing a poor bond.
