

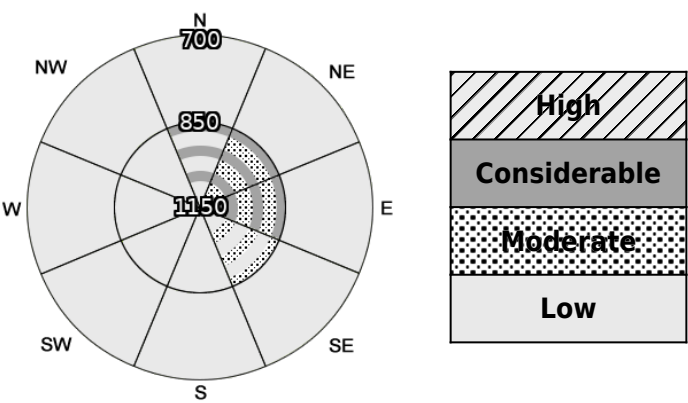

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 04/03/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow and strong Westerly winds will form areas of weakly bonded windslab in sheltered locations mainly above 850 metres. Sheltered summit gullies and slopes with a North through East to South-Easterly aspect in particular where older snow underlies will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Becoming colder with frequent and occasionally heavy snow showers overnight and scattered snow showers through the course of the day. Winds will be from a mainly Westerly direction strong overnight becoming fresh by morning.

Comments

A return to more Wintry conditions with freezing levels lowering to 500 metres by morning. The older snowpack will become firm and icy in places. New cornices will be weakly bonded.
