

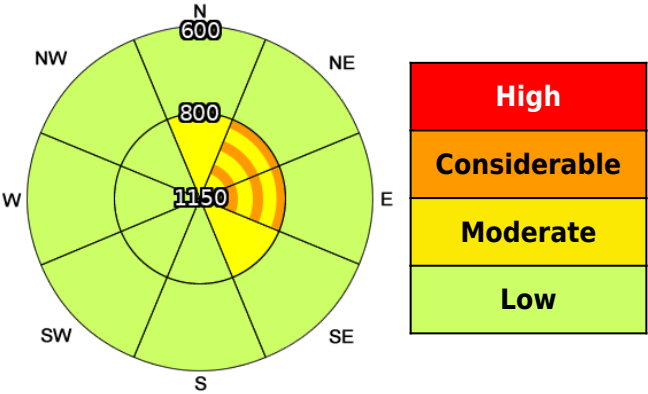

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 07/03/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining snowpack will become wet at all levels. Existing areas of windslab on North to East aspects will initially go through a period of instability. Later, accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will develop in sheltered locations primarily on North-East to South-East facing slopes above 800 metres. Corrie rims and tops of gullies especially affected . The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy rain at all levels overnight on very strong Southerly winds will turn to snow showers by morning. Overnight the freezing level of 1500 metres will fall to 900 metres as the wind veers Westerly and eases. During the day there will be snow showers on moderate Westerly winds with the freezing level gradually lowering to 300 metres.

Wet overnight but colder and snowier tomorrow.
