

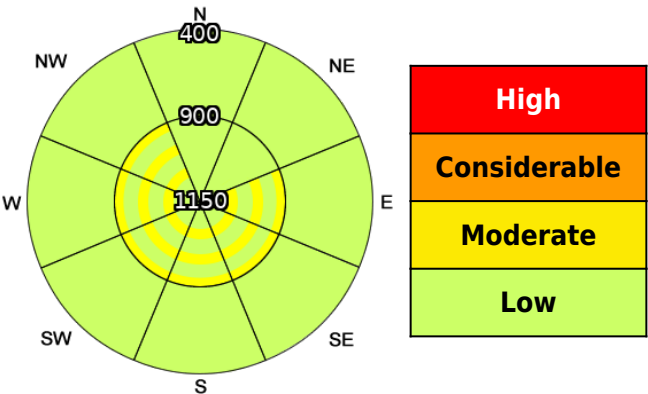

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 05/04/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snow cover in most areas will generally be too thin to be significant and stability will be good but pockets of existing and fresh unstable windslab will exist in sheltered East through South to North-Westerly aspects mainly above 900 metres. Gully exits and sheltered hollows of the above aspects will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Some sleet and snow in the morning on the higher slopes for a short time before turning light. Winds will be fresh from the North-West. Freezing level will be 400 metres overnight rising to 1000 metres.

Comments

New snow amounts are not expected to be great. Unstable areas of windslab should generally be avoidable with some considered route planning.
