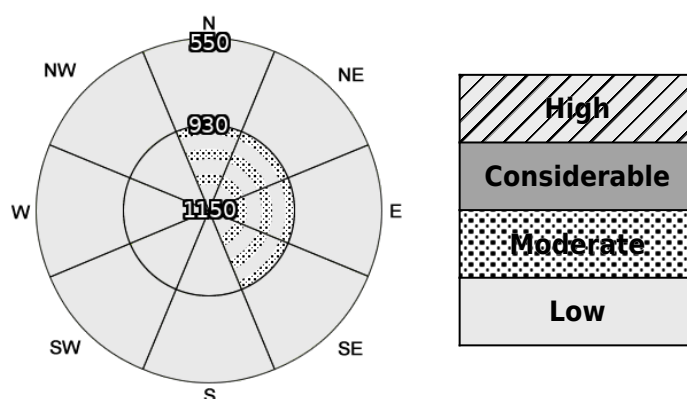


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 07/04/2012****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Some isolated pockets of windslab will form in sheltered locations mainly above 930 metres on North through East to South-East aspects. Where these accumulations form in depth they will be poorly bonded, gully exits and steep scarp slopes particularly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, mainly dry conditions but becoming colder. During the day, some light snow showers mainly above 900 metres followed by sleet then rain as the freezing rises to 1200 metres. The winds will be moderate North-North-West backing to Westerly.

Comments

New snow amounts are not expected to be significant and areas of instability avoidable. Summit temperatures will be between 1 and 4 degrees celsius.
