

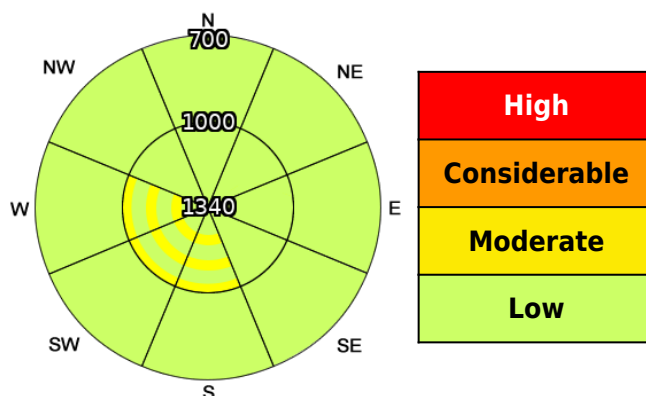
THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 08/04/2012

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will persist on steep slopes in the generally localised areas of moderately bonded windslab lying mainly on South to West aspects above 1000 metres. Some fresh snow may be deposited during the later afternoon on North through East to South-East aspects above 1000 metres but accumulations are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light rain is expected at all levels overnight and during the morning, then turning to sleet at higher levels as the freezing level drops to around the summits, before becoming mainly dry. During the later afternoon there is the chance of some snow showers above 900 metres. Winds are expected to be strong, North-Westerly overnight and mainly Westerly during the day.

Comments

Freezing level is expected to drop below the summits during Sunday afternoon.
