

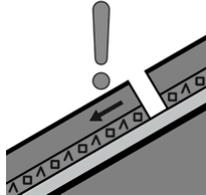

#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 21/12/2012


##### Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded, deep accumulations of windslab will continue to form on mainly West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gullies, Corrie rims and slopes in North facing corries being most affected. Cornices will be unstable and likely to collapse. Below 900 metres the snowpack will generally be well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong South-Easterly winds will continue overnight and through the day, decreasing slightly as the day progresses. Precipitation will continue through the forecast period, falling as snow above 550 metres.

##### Comments

Poor weather continues, very good snow cover, therefore any avalanches will run further than usual.
