

Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will be present in sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Fresh cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind is expected to be East-South-Easterly or South-Easterly, very strong overnight and easing steadily through the day. Overnight and through the morning snow will fall above 550 metres. The freezing level is expected to be around 600 metres, rising later in the day to 800 metres.
