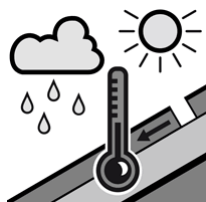


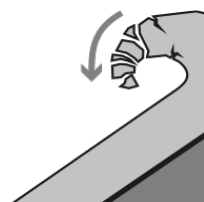

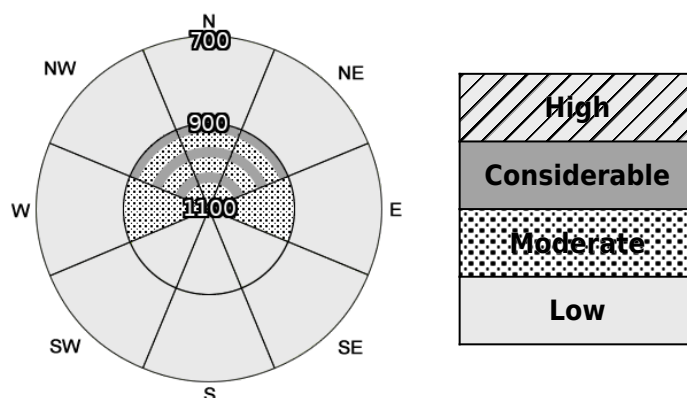

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be some improvement to stability at all elevations as summit temperatures drop below freezing overnight. Residual cornices give rise to a localised hazard, remaining suspect where they persist above North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

South-Westerly winds will decrease throughout the day becoming South-Easterly by mid-afternoon. The fluctuating temperatures will result in showers of snow around summit levels, temperature will fall to a low of -0.4 degree Celsius by 07:00 hours at 100 metres.
