

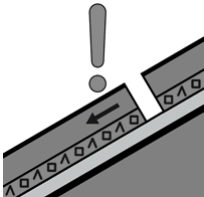

Wind Slab



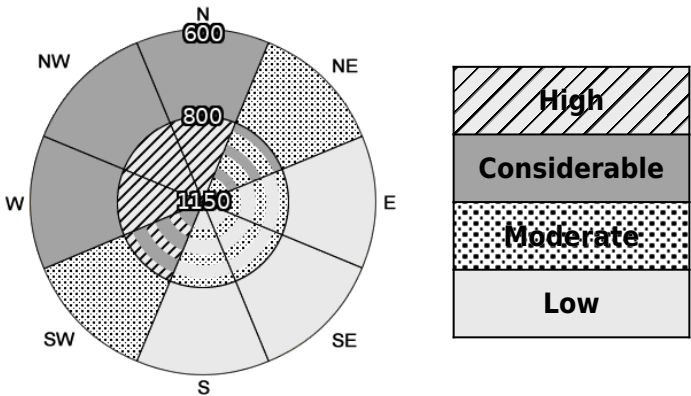
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will rapidly form on South-West through West to North aspects above 800 metres where avalanches will occur. Accumulations at lower levels will increase; however greatest depth will be found in sheltered locations above 800 metres. Rapidly forming cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Persistent, at times, heavy snowfall overnight will gradually ease during the day. Overnight, very strong East-South-Easterly winds will ease slightly as the day progresses. Freezing level 150 metres.

Comments

Weather conditions will ease during Tuesday. Stability will remain very poor.
