

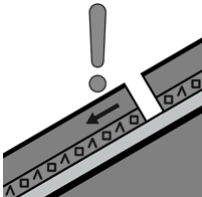

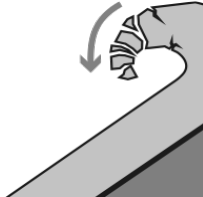
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



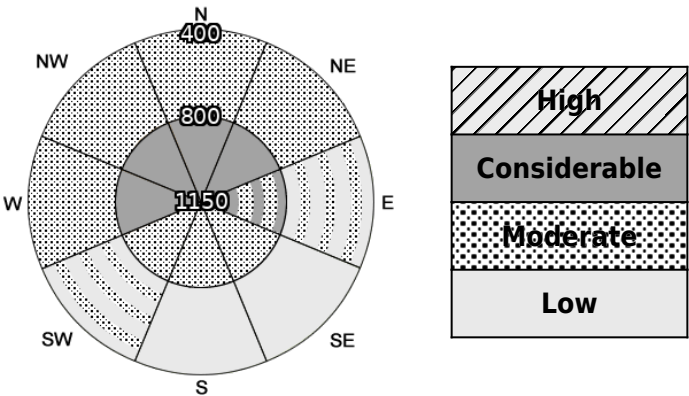
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable deposits of both hard and soft windslab will remain in sheltered areas on West through North to East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Soft freshly formed cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will slowly die out through the period, and South-Easterly winds will ease. It will remain cold with a freezing level of around 300 metres.
