

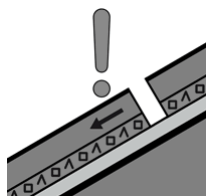

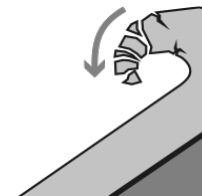

Wind Slab



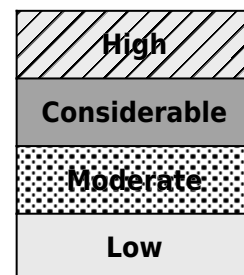
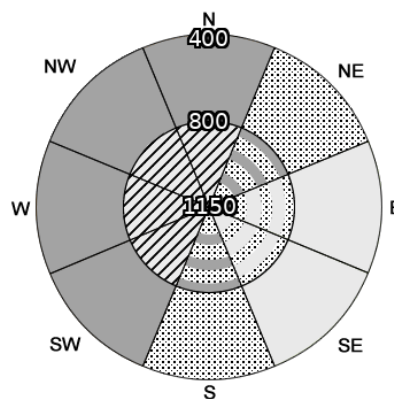

Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow and heavy drifting will continue to accumulate weakly bonded windslab on South-West through West to North aspects above 800 metres where avalanches will occur. Distribution and depth of accumulations will also increase below this altitude. Large, fragile cornices will continue to form. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snow will ease to showers during the day. Strong East-South-Easterly winds overnight will ease and veer South-Easterly. Freezing level 150 metres.

Comments

There is significant quantities of fresh lying snow. Large drifts present.
