

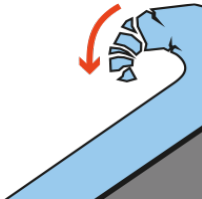

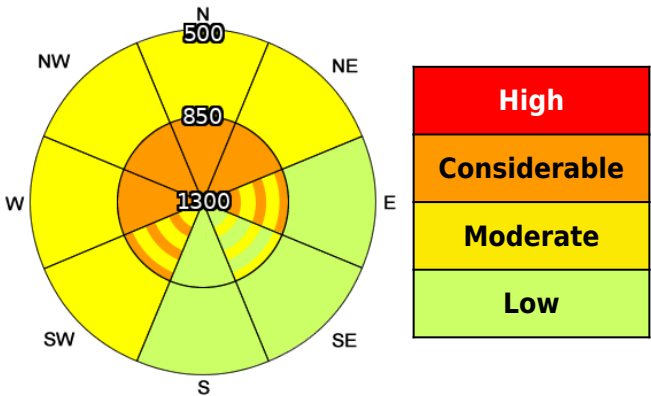
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh windslab deposits will form on mainly North-West to North-Easterly aspects above 850 metres where avalanches are likely. Gullies, corrie rims and scarp slopes in North facing corries will be especially affected. Also, on Westerly aspects additional accumulations will further weaken the snowpack. Weak windslab will form on other aspects due to cross loading. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight, freezing at all levels and with strong Southerly winds. During the day the Southerly winds will increase in strength with moderate snowfall.. The freezing level will rise to 400 metres.

Comments

More snowfall expected, but gradually getting warmer at the weekend and the start of next week.
