




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The moist snowpack will slowly re-freeze and consolidate in the cooler daytime temperatures and will generally be well bonded and stable throughout. Some localised accumulations of moderately well bonded windslab will form in isolated wind sheltered locations above 1000 metres on mainly North-West to Easterly aspects. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight strong South then West-South-Westerly winds with sleet and snow showers on the tops, freezing levels 1200 metres at first falling to 900m. In the day freezing levels will fall to around 800 metres and precipitation will fall as occasional snow showers above 500 metres.
