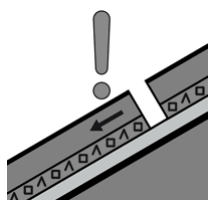


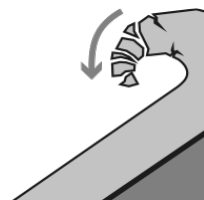

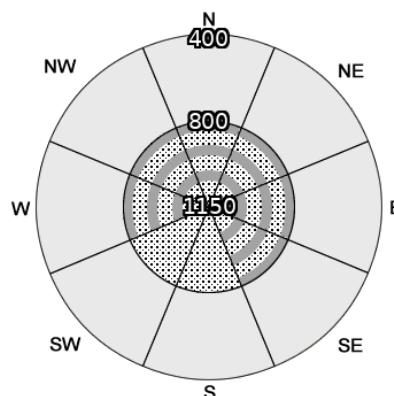
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

As the freezing level drops the snowpack will start to refreeze above around 800 metres. New snow accumulations will be light but instabilities will persist within deeper deposits that will be found on Westerly through North to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Greatest hazard will be found on steeper slopes such as scarp slopes and gully exits. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The winds will become strong and veer Westerly. The freezing level will drop from around 1200 metres overnight to around 800 metres during the day and there will be some occasional snowfall.

Comments

Another poor day for observations. The snowpack will start to refreeze as the freezing level drops.
