

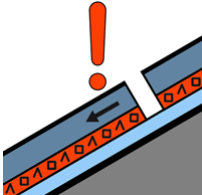

Avalanche Problems



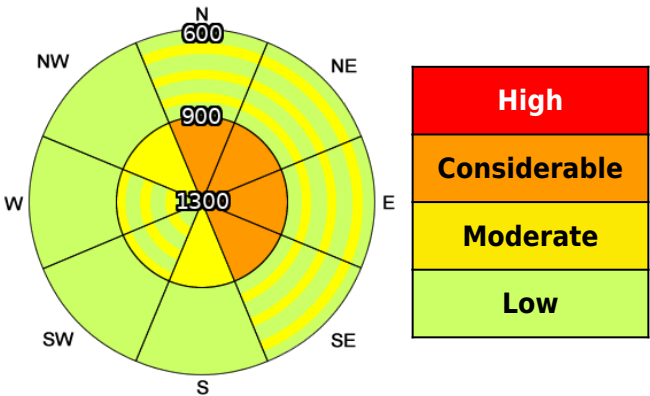
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will be re-frozen and will generally be well bonded and stable in all areas. However new accumulations of unstable windslab will be present on mainly Northerly through East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres, gully exits, coire rims and scarp slopes especially affected. Many areas will be scoured and stable. Unstable cornices. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight it is expected to be dry with strong North-Westerly winds at first, becoming South-Westerly by morning, Freezing level 800 metres. In the day winds will be light North-Easterly then North-Westerly with a freezing level of 600 metres. Precipitation falling as occasional snow showers above 300 metres.
