##### Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised poorly bonded windslab deposits will persist on East to South-Easterly aspects mainly above 1000 metres. Re-distributed snow will accumulate new windslab into localised sheltered places on steep South-East to South-Westerly aspects. Elsewhere, especially at lower levels below 1000 metres, the snowpack will generally be well bonded and stable and many places will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Light variable winds overnight becoming North-Easterly with snow showers, freezing level 600 metres. In the day light Northerly winds light at first becoming strong with precipitation falling as snow showers above 200 metres.
