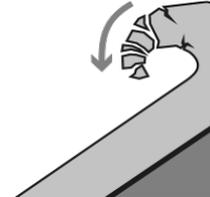



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a period of high instability during the rising temperatures. Avalanches are likely on steep North through East to Southerly aspects above 900 metres. A consolidation period is then expected during the cooler temperatures. New accumulations will develop on Easterly aspects mostly around corrie rims, gully tops and crag aprons. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight significant snowfall, then heavy sleet and rain at all levels on strong South-West veering Westerly winds. During the day the freezing level will fall to 600 metres with light snow showers on strong South-West winds.

Comments

Instabilities most prominent during rise in temperature. Cooler in the day then milder with rain again, early Sunday evening.
