

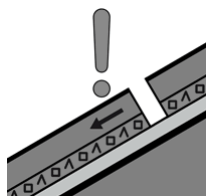

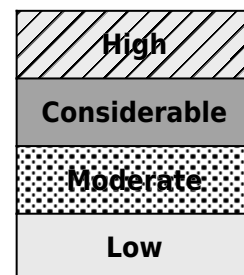
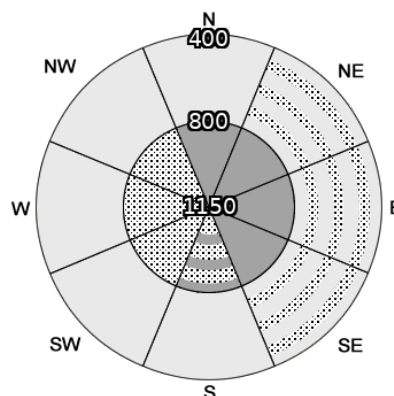
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poor to weakly bonded windslab will be found in very sheltered locations on Northerly through Easterly to Southerly aspects above 800 metres. Stability will become particularly poor with the arrival of rain and a rise in the freezing level and avalanches are likely. Elsewhere the snowpack will mostly remain well bonded with many areas scoured by strong winds. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be moderate amounts of snow overnight before a rise in the freezing level and high amounts of rain early morning. The freezing level will drop to around 600 metres during the day. The winds will be very strong from the West overnight before easing slightly and turning South-West.

Comments

An interesting weather forecast for tomorrow morning particularly with the possibility of rain for a while early morning.
