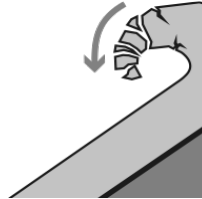

Wind Slab



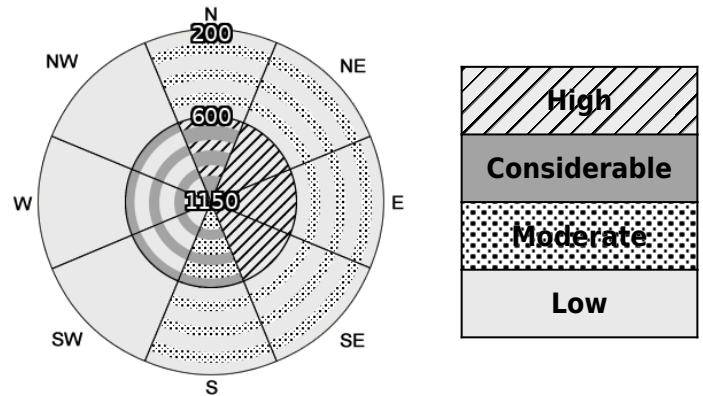
Persistent Weak Layers

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Deep unstable windslab will exist and continue to form through the course of the day in sheltered gullies of many aspects and especially on slopes with a North through East to Southerly aspect mainly above 600 metres where Avalanches will occur. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be cold with heavy snow showers and very strong Westerly winds overnight and on Monday. Forecast depths of new snow are 15cm overnight and a further 20cm through the day. New snow will affect most altitudes.

**Comments**

A cold and very stormy period of weather is expected which will give a lot of new snow to the area. Extensive drifting will form widespread instabilities in all sheltered locations.
