

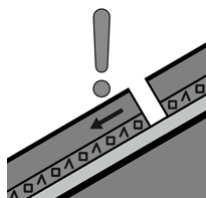

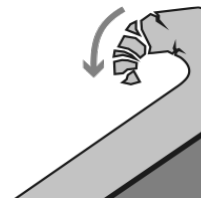

Wind Slab



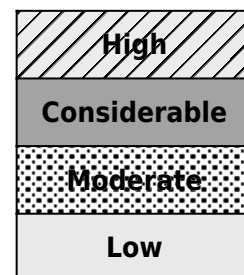
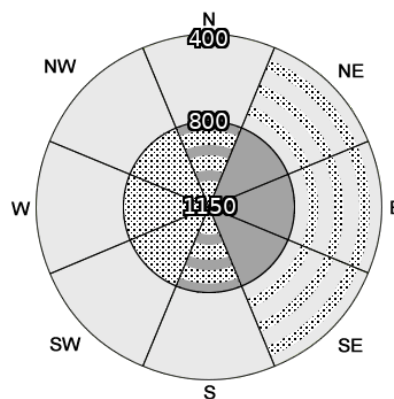

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be well bonded and stable in most locations; however accumulations of unstable windslab will continue to develop in very sheltered locations mostly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Greatest hazard will be found on corrie rims and gully exits. Sheltered locations on Northerly and Southerly aspects will also hold windslab due to cross loading. Unstable cornices will develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be some very light snow down to valley level. Winds will be very strong from the West.

It is likely to be a challenging day with very strong winds forecast.
