

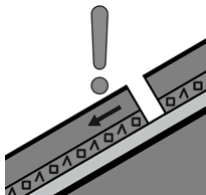

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 04/02/2013

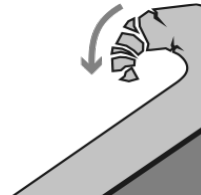
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



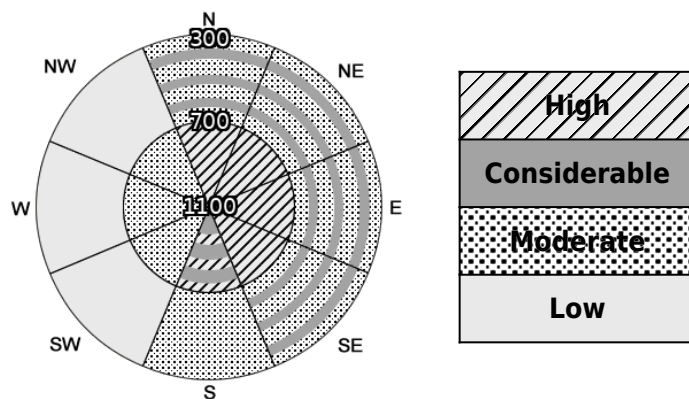
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Deep fresh unstable windslab will be deposited on all sheltered hollows, slopes and gullies. Greatest accumulations will be on North through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres where avalanches will occur. Other aspects will be affected by cross loading. Fresh cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be very strong Westerly throughout. Frequent heavy snow showers at all levels are expected throughout the forecast period, producing significant accumulations. Freezing at all levels.

Comments

Westerly 80mph winds, with gusts of 120 mph, are expected during Monday.
