



### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 06/02/2013


#### Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Deep accumulations of unstable windslab will form on East through South to South-Westerly aspects mainly above 900 metres where avalanches will occur. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Weaknesses will also persist in the windslab which is present on North-Easterly aspects. Many areas on West to North aspects remain scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be High



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight and during the day winds will be very strong Northerly. Precipitation will fall as heavy snow falls through the night and during the day. A cold day with freezing levels around 0-300 metres.

#### Comments

Many wind scoured areas but snow generally poor where it has accumulated in sheltered places, good terrain travel skills important.
