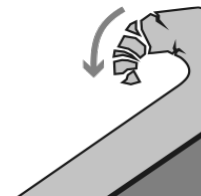
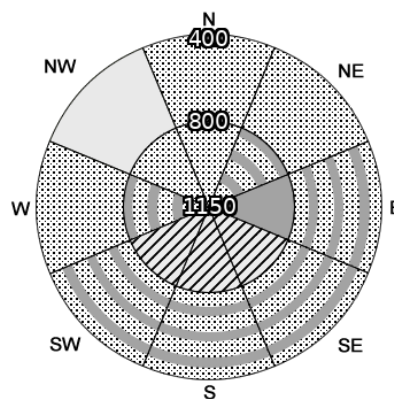


**THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE HIGH****Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 06/02/2013****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Deep accumulations of unstable windslab will develop mostly on South-East to South-West aspects above 800 metres where avalanches will occur. Poorly bonded windslab will also be present in sheltered locations on North-East, East and West aspects due to cross loading. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Areas exposed to the winds will remain scoured and well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be High.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight moderate snowfall will become showery during the day with the freezing level dropping to valley level. The winds will remain strong from the North.

**Comments**

The snowpack is very variable at the moment. New snow in any hollow or sheltered feature and hard snow-ice in any exposed areas.
