



### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 07/02/2013


#### Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow will continue to load the unstable areas of deep windslab on mainly South-Easterly through South to South-Westerly aspects above 800 metres where avalanches will occur. Unstable windslab will also persist in steep, localised North-East to East aspects above 800 metres. Other aspects will be affected with unstable snow due to cross loading. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Arctic Northerly airflow will continue with strong North-North-Westerly winds, snowfall to all levels and continued drifting overnight. During the day snow showers dying out during the morning. Strong West-North-West then North-Westerly winds will continue. Freezing level will rise to 500 metres

#### Comments

A very wintry outlook for the next few days at least. Good travel in avalanche terrain skills required.
