

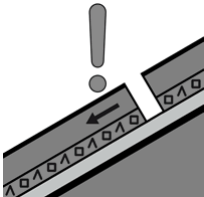

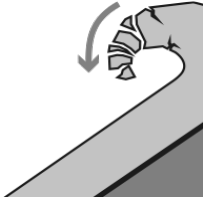

Wind Slab



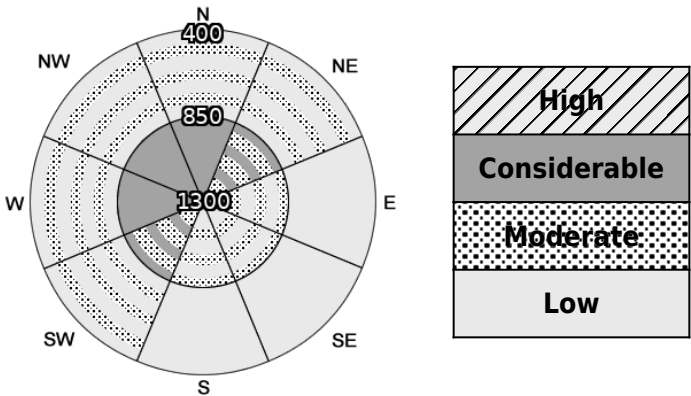
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop and avalanches are likely mainly on Westerly to Northerly aspects above 850 metres especially around corrie rims, gully tops, flanks, and crag aprons. Cross loading will affect other aspects. Wind exposed slopes will become eroded and be mostly stable with localised instabilities in sheltered areas. Cornices will develop and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will continue into the night and gradually die out during the day. South-East winds are expected to ease to Moderate and the freezing level will be at 400 metres.
