

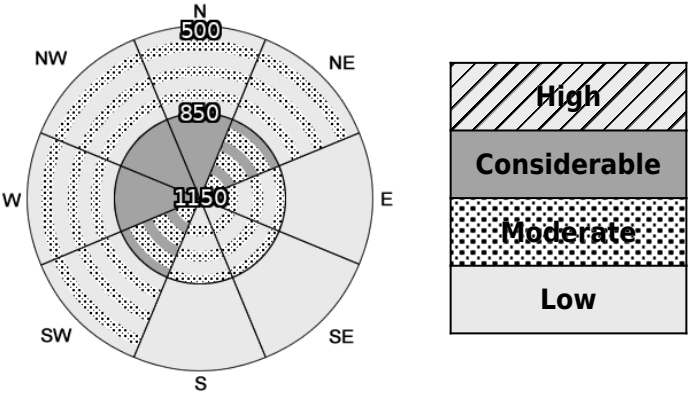

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 11/02/2013

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop and avalanches are likely mainly on Westerly to Northerly aspects above 850 metres. Cross loading will affect other aspects especially around corrie rims, gully exits and flanks. Wind exposed slopes will become eroded and be mostly stable with localised instabilities in sheltered areas. Cornices will develop and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snow showers these should clear by morning. The winds, strong, South-Easterly, easing slightly during the day.
