

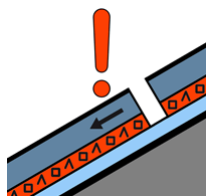

Wind Slab



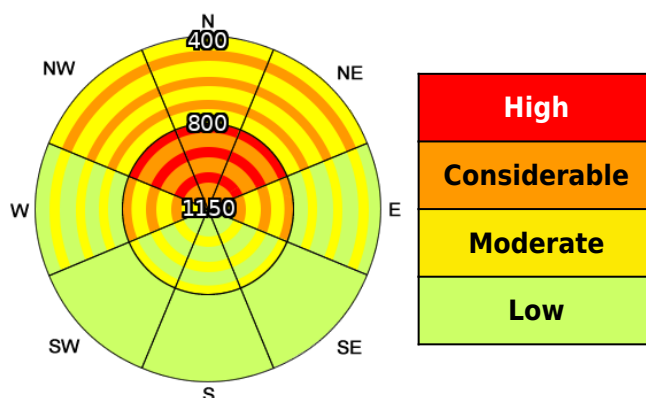
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will form in sheltered locations on mainly North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches will occur especially as the freezing level rises. Poor to weakly bonded deposits will be present at lower elevations on these aspects and cross-loaded deposits will also be found. Unstable cornices will form. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow flurries overnight will be followed by a band of snow moving from the West during the day. The snowfall will be heavy at times and will be accompanied by very strong Southerly winds. The freezing level will rise from 100 metres to 1200 metres by the afternoon.

Comments

Expect very difficult mountain conditions.
