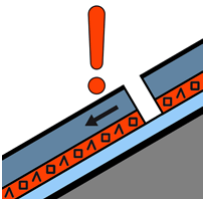

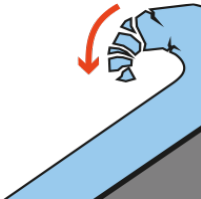

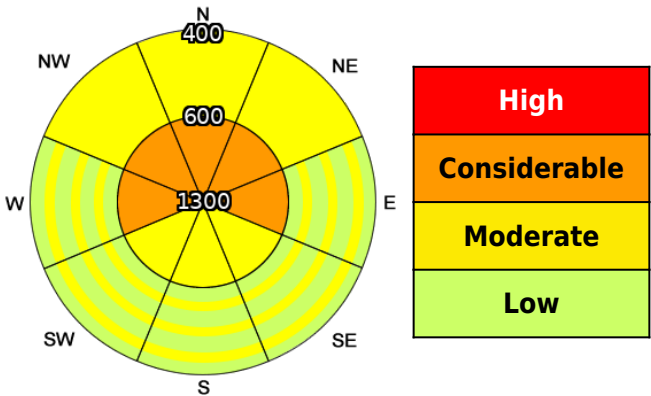

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack on Westerly through North to Easterly aspects will continue to be unstable above 600 metres where avalanches are likely, here, as cooler temperatures develop, the snowpack will gradually improve in all areas above 900 metres but will remain quite moist and moderately well bonded below, steep slopes and convex terrain being most affected. Cornices will remain unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

In the early part of the night heavy precipitation falling a sleet and snow above 1000 metres, with moderate South-Westerly winds and a freezing level of 1200 metres. During early hours and the day no precipitation is expected, winds will be South-Westerly then Westerly with the freezing level lowering to 900 metres.
