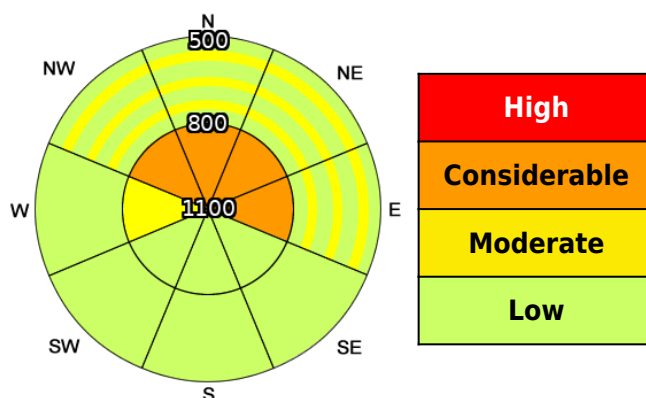

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will persist and avalanches are likely where areas of deep weakly bonded windslab have formed on North-West through North to East aspects above 800m. There will be consolidation with improved stability of all accumulations at lower elevations. Cornices which have formed over all steep lee areas remain suspect. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Fluctuating freezing levels overnight to around summits falling again to 750 metres. Snow showers will die out as it becomes drier and clearer during the day. Winds initially South-West will become more Westerly and remain fresh to moderate as day progresses
