Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a period of avalanche activity overnight as the freezing level rises to the highest summits. Poor to weakly bonded windslab will be found on mainly North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres with cross-loaded deposits present on other aspects. Avalanches are likely in steeper, sheltered locations. Stability will gradually improve as the freezing level lowers. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight sleet will ease to give a mostly dry day. Moderate South-Westerly winds will freshen and veer Westerly. The freezing level will lower from 1200 to 900 metres.
