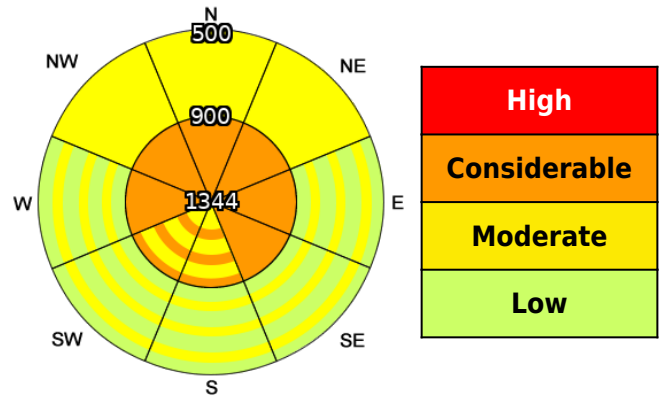

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will be present in sheltered areas, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects will be affected by cross-loading. Weaknesses will persist in the older windslab that lies mainly on West through North to North-East aspects. Cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers are expected throughout the forecast period; above 1000 metres overnight and frequent this evening, above 800 metres and less frequent during the day. Winds are expected to be strong West-South-Westerly veering Westerly overnight, Westerly during the day and easing.
