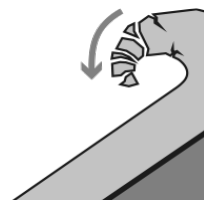
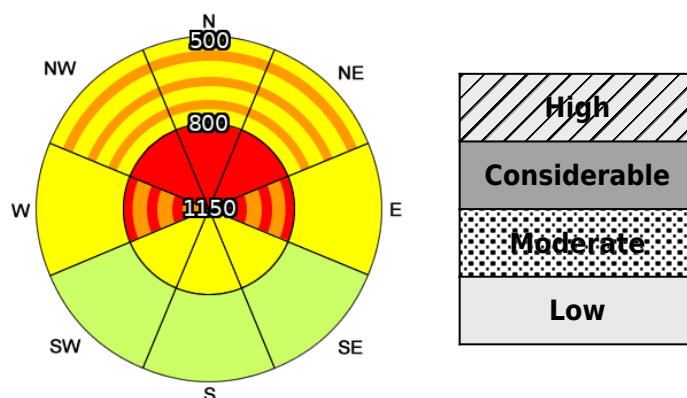


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 26/02/2013****Avalanche Problems****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will remain firm and icy in many locations. The surface of slopes affected by solar warming will soften slightly but general snowpack stability will remain good. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The settled dry conditions will continue with frosts overnight and less cold through the day. Winds will be light from the South-West. Visibility expected to be superb.

Comments

High pressure continues to dominate the weather giving fine, settled, cold and dry conditions. Widespread firm snow-ice exists on many slopes where serious run out potential onto rock and scree exists. Larger cornices may become prone to collapse with rising daytime temperatures.
