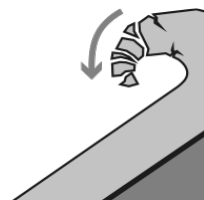
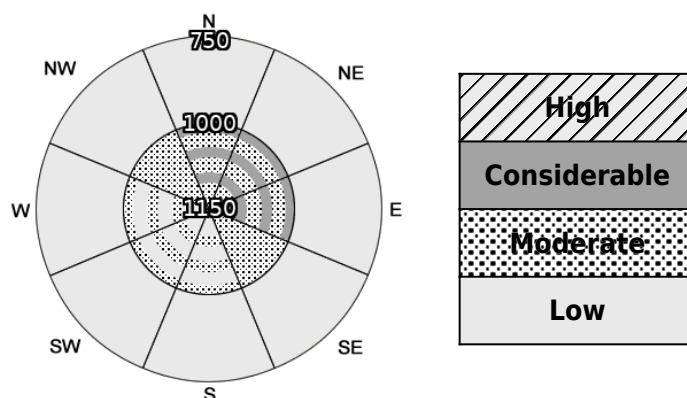


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 28/02/2013****Avalanche Problems****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

There will be some softening of the snowpack surface, especially on slopes subjected to the sun, but the snowpack will remain generally stable. There may be some deposition of wet snow on mainly East to South aspects above 900 metres but amounts are not expected to be significant. Cornices will be prone to collapse in warmer temperatures. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level is expected to fluctuate but mainly be around or above the summits. It is expected to be dry overnight. During the day some light precipitation may reach the area from the North possibly falling as sleet at higher levels. Winds are expected to be moderate to strong North-Westerly during the day and easing.
