

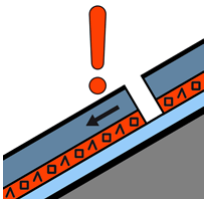

Wind Slab



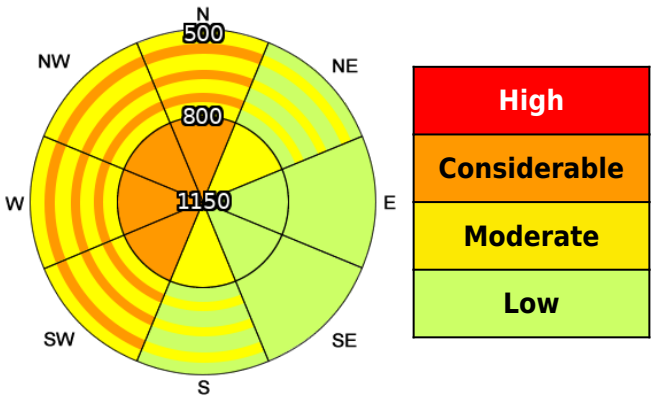
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snow showers and redistributed deposits will continue to form poor to weakly bonded windslab on mainly South-West through West to North aspects from 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Cross-loading of other aspects will occur. Sheltered locations such as gully exits and scarp slopes will be worst affected and unstable cornices will continue to form. Wind scoured slopes will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Isolated light snow showers overnight will precede occasional snow showers during the day. Very cold with a 300 metre freezing level. Strong East-North-Easterly winds.

Comments

Very cold temperatures forecast: Cold, dry deposits will continue to drift when precipitation has ceased.
