

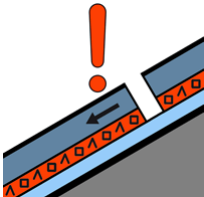

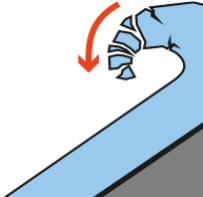

Wind Slab



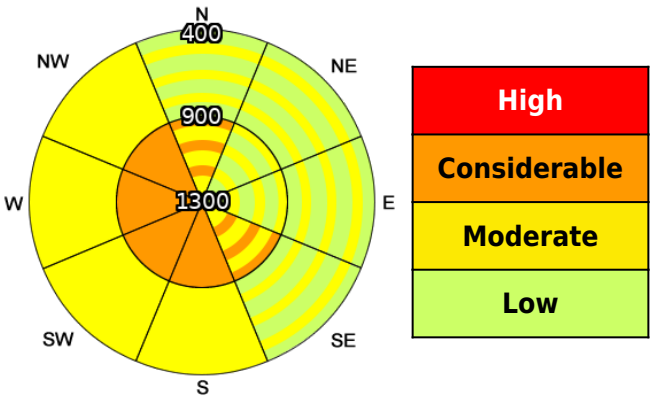
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of poorly bonded windslab be present on mainly South-East through South to Westerly aspects above 900 metres. Localised areas of windslab will also remain on North-West to North aspects above 900 metres, gully flanks, scarp slopes and gully exits most affected. On other aspects the snowpack is scoured, firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, light snow showers are expected with a freezing level of 300 metres and moderate Northerly winds. During the day winds will remain Northerly, strengthening slightly. Snow showers are expected with a freezing level around 500 metres.
