

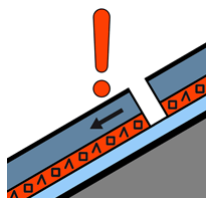

Wind Slab



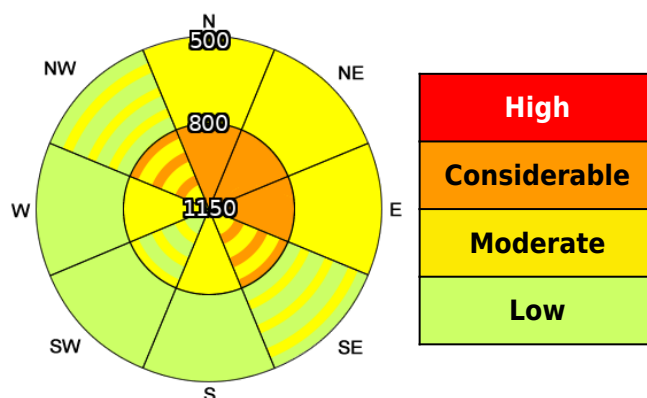
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further unstable windslab will develop mostly on North to East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Greatest hazard will be on gully exits and steeper scarp slopes with areas of moderately bonded snow found at lower altitudes. Areas exposed to the winds will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be moderate snowfall to around 600 metres. This will be accompanied by strong South-Westerly winds which will ease during the day.

Comments

The snowpack is becoming very varied, careful route choice required in places.
