

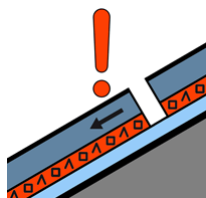

Wind Slab



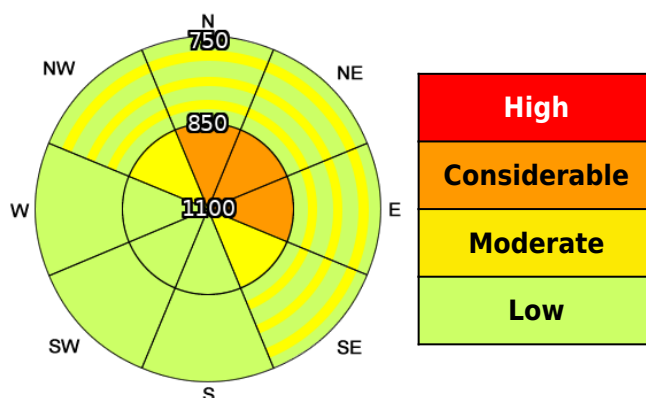
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of windslab will develop above 750 metres on high lee sheltered locations, as accumulations achieve depth new snow instabilities will exist and avalanches are likely on mostly North to East facing slopes and gullies above 850 metres, with some cross loading onto other aspects. Some new cornice development will occur around coire rims in these locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

More significant snow showers are forecast overnight and during the day, accompanied by fresh South-Westerly winds which will ease as the showery airflow brings snow down to 300 metres. Freezing levels which will rise slightly overnight are forecast to settle around 750 metres during the day.

Comments

Little by way of new snow end of day Thurs – more significant change expected for overnight and on Friday.
