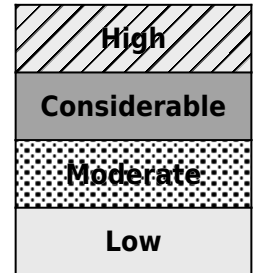
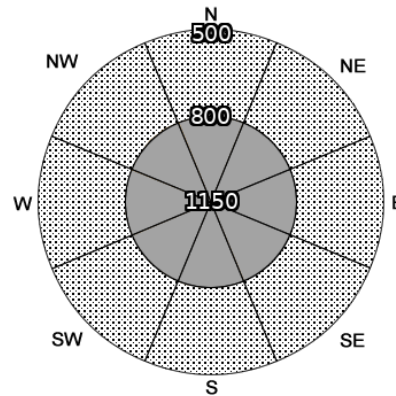

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Significant deposits of poorly bonded windslab will remain on North to East aspects and in other sheltered locations above 800 metres. However, fresh unstable windslab will be deposited on most other aspects above 800 metres throughout the day. Avalanches are likely on steep slopes and in gullies on many aspects. Cornices will remain fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall overnight will become more persistent during the day. Light and variable winds will strengthen and become North-Easterly. The freezing level will be around 300 metres.
