

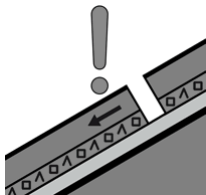

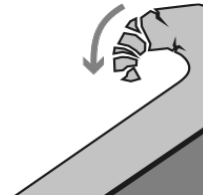
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



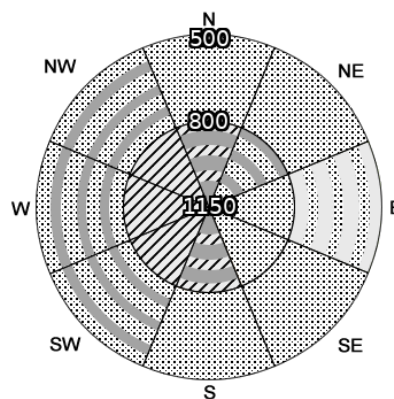
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable windslab will rapidly form mainly on South-Westerly to North-Westerly aspects above 800 metres with other aspects also being affected by cross-loading and avalanches will occur. At lower altitudes accumulations will be poor to weakly bonded on steeper terrain features. New cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be overnight snowfall to around valley level which will become more prolonged during the day. Winds will be very strong from the East.

Comments

Its likely to be a very poor day on the hill with high amounts of snow and high winds.
