

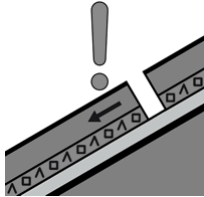

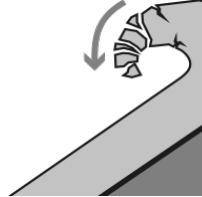

Wind Slab



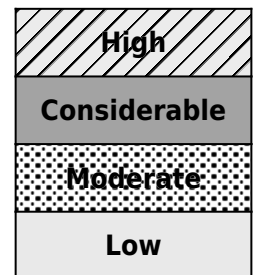
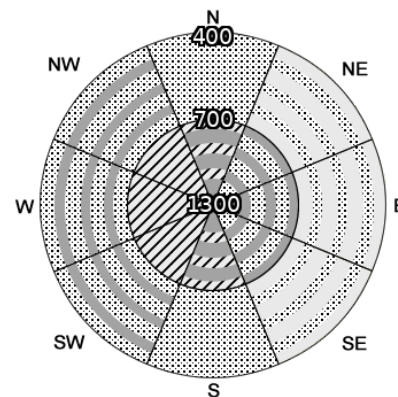
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Severe drifting with new accumulations of weakly bonded windslab developing. Avalanches will occur on South-West to North-West aspects above 700 metres. Cross loading will affect North and South aspects. Instabilities will remain on steep, sheltered and convex locations on North-East to South-East aspects. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy and prolonged snowfall is expected over the forecast period. East winds will increase to strong and the freezing level will fall from 400 to 200 metres.
