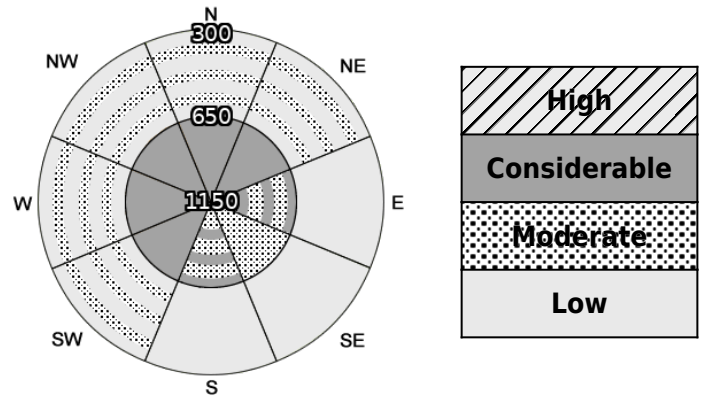

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to form on many slopes mainly above 650 metres. Greatest accumulations will be on slopes with a South-West through West, North to North-Easterly aspect where avalanches are likely. Sheltered areas such as gullies and hollows of other aspects will also be affected with weak deposits due to cross loading. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The very strong South-Easterly airflow will continue. It will remain cold with no new snow expected.

Comments

Remaining very cold with strong winds. Weakness will continue to exist within all deeper accumulations of both old and new windslab.
